The Wheatland Town Council held their regular meeting on February 8 in the Council Chambers. Vouchers in the amount of \$752,916.18 were approved for payment. The next meeting will be March 14 in Council Chambers beginning at 7:00 p.m.

The Platte County Library is undergoing extensive remodeling. Library board member Jeannie Mitchell was on hand to share information about the excitement. The library offers many services to various organizations in the community at no charge. It was agreed to waive building permit fees for the library's project.

A public hearing was held in regard to approving liquor licenses. Liquor licenses for Pizza Hut, Los Dominguez, Tasty Treats, and a club liquor license for the Moose Lodge and Wheatland County Club were all approved.

\* Ordinance No. 795 as it relates to Bar and Grill License Fees, and Microbrewery Permits was approved for third and final reading.

- Ordinance 798 defining recreational vehicles and trailers was approved as presented for second reading.
- Ordinance 799 regarding rezoning of property at 1006 16th Street was approved on second reading.
- Ordinance 797 regarding cleaning debris from sidewalks died for lack of a motion on second reading.
- Ordinance 796 as it relates to the collection of delinquent utility bills was presented for first reading. After lengthy discussion and several changes the Ordinance passed.

A Resolution supporting the Wyoming Association of Municipalities agenda for seeking appropriation of state funding for all Wyoming cities and towns was adopted.

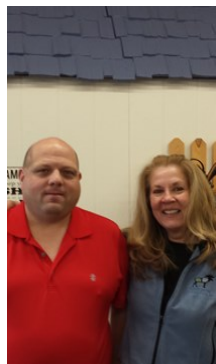
